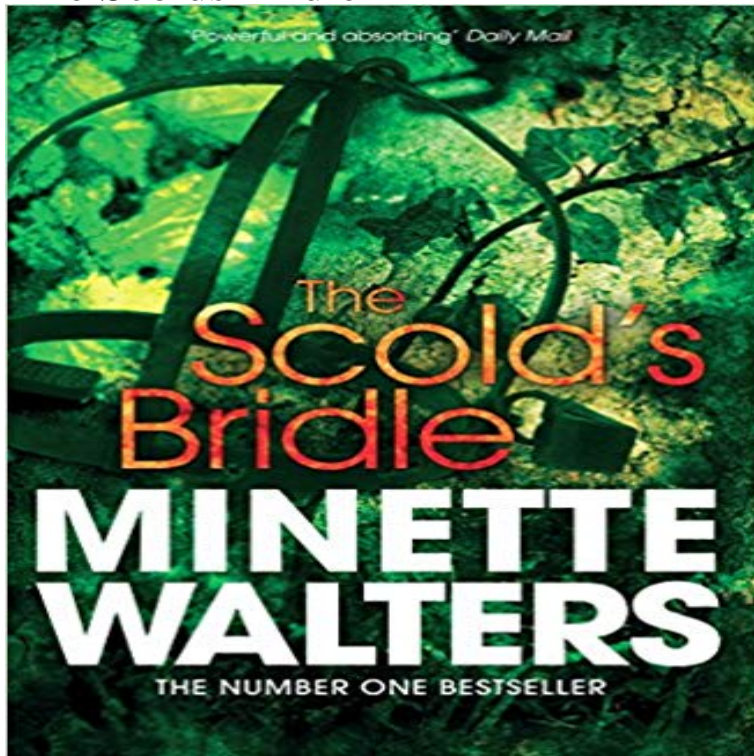


The Scolds Bridle
